Mark your Bible at: Matthew 5:16; Matthew 25:35-40; John 15:12; 1 John 3:17; Galatians 6:2; Philippians 2:4.

Activity Plan

1. Say this prayer or something similar to begin.

God, your Son came to seek and serve. Make us bold to follow his example. Strengthen our faith. *Amen.*

- 2. Make a resolution to increase the time you spend serving others in the months ahead. Write down your resolution.
- 3. Read the following scriptures from your Bible or from the text at the end of this activity: Matthew 5:16; Matthew 25:35-40; John 15:12; 1 John 3:17; Galatians 6:2; Philippians 2:4. What do these verses say about serving? Write the verse that speaks to you most strongly in a place where you will see it each time you check your calendar or to-do list.
- 4. Select a person whom you want to serve and encourage. Make a list of times or days when you might do something that communicates to this person that he or she matters to you and to God. Make a second list of simple ways you can serve this person. Remember that serving others is doing something that communicates or affirms their worth without expectation of recognition. Some ways you might serve: Offer to look over a project for accuracy or clarity, practice brainstorming responses to questions the other person might face in a work situation, help the other person carry materials to his or her work area or another destination, help him or her find a needed resource on-line, do a household or yard chore "on the sly."
- 5. Discuss with a trusted friend how you will speak about faith with the person you are serving when the opportunity arises. You might tell how God has blessed you and that you seek to share that blessing in your serving. Use words that make sense in the relationship you have with the person served.
- 6. For the next few days, watch for opportunities to serve the person you selected. Check in with your trusted friend at the end of each day to tell about what you have done (unless you are serving that trusted friend).
- 7. As you practice these simple acts of serving, pray that God will show you more opportunities to serve others. Ask God to help you make serving a routine part of your life.
